

- In 2020, FortisBC was able to support local organizations with \$12,000 given


District of Squamish

• In 2020, FortisBC paid \$240,179 in taxes to the District of Squamish




What is the Eagle Mountain – Woodfibre Gas Pipeline

(EGP) Project?






What is EGP: Pipeline - Squamish






What is EGP: Tunnel






What is EGP: Squamish Compressor Station




EGP Construction Schedule in Squamish*

Regulatory Update

- BC EAC Amendment Application filed October 23rd
 - EAO public comment period (Nov 9 through Dec 23)
 - 4 amendments, 2 near Squamish
 - Stawamus Corridor Expansion to accommodate alternative route
 - Squamish Compressor Station at Woodfibre site
- BC EAC Extension Request filed October 30th
- Ongoing engagement with Indigenous Nations, municipalities, regulators and the public
- Ongoing engagement with Squamish Nation through the SN Environmental Assessment Agreement Process.
- Developing EAC Conditions Management Plans.







Workforce Accommodation Planning

Workforce Accommodation Strategy

 Following discussions with the District of Squamish and other community leaders, it was recommended that FortisBC look into the possibility of a workcamp to avoid further pressure on the Squamish housing market

Work Camp Contractor selection:

- Request for Expression of Interest sent to market in April
- Community Table #3 input will inform Request For Proposal
