

Canadian Navigable Waters Act

FortisBC Energy Inc. as part of the **Eagle Mountain – Woodfibre Gas Pipeline Project** hereby gives notice that a submission has been added to the Navigable Waters Registry pursuant to the Canadian Navigable Waters Act for a 30-day public comment period described herein and its site and plans beginning **March 16, 2024**.

Pursuant to paragraph 10(1)(b) of the said Act, FortisBC Energy Inc. has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) and under registry number **10235**, a description of the following work, its site and plans:

Proposed Work: Construction of a temporary bridge on the Indian River.

Where: The center coordinates of the proposed bridge are:

- **Latitude: 49.527 N**
- **Longitude: - 122.903 W**

Expected Duration: Activities are planned to begin on May 15th, 2024 and conclude by September 30th, 2024.
